

BLOCK TRANSFER AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
PACIFIC COAST UNIVERSITY FOR WORKPLACE HEALTH SCIENCES
AND
NORTH ISLAND COLLEGE

Further to the cooperation Memorandum of Agreement signed in 2012 between North Island College (NIC) and the Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS), the purpose of this Agreement is to set out degree completion options to students in the Human Services Diploma and the Human Services Certificate programs, i.e. Indigenous Focus and Educational Support Assistant/Community Support.

Human Services Diploma

Students who complete the Human Services Diploma program at NIC and enrol in the PCU-WHS Bachelor of Disability Management (BDM) program will receive 45 credits toward the Bachelor of Disability Management Degree.

In order to complete the BDM program and be awarded the degree, these NIC students will need to complete 75 credits from the courses listed at PCU-WHS as outlined in Appendix I attached.

An individual learning plan will be agreed with each student when he or she registers with PCU-WHS.

This is a block transfer of the credential and not a course-by-course articulation.

Human Services Certificates – Indigenous Focus and Educational Support Assistant/Community Support

Students who complete the Human Services Certificates – Indigenous Focus and Educational Support/Community Support programs at NIC and enrol in the PCU-WHS Bachelor of Disability Management (BDM) program will receive 24 credits toward the Bachelor of Disability Management Degree.

In order to complete the BDM program and be awarded the degree, these NIC students will need to complete 96 credits from the courses listed at PCU-WHS as outlined in Appendix II attached.

An individual learning plan will be agreed with each student when he or she registers with PCU-WHS.

This is a block transfer of the credential and not a course-by-course articulation.

Social Services Diploma

Students who complete the Social Services Diploma program at NIC and enrol in the PCU-WHS Bachelor of Disability Management (BDM) program will receive 45 credits toward the Bachelor of Disability Management Degree.

In order to complete the BDM program and be awarded the degree, these NIC students will need to complete 75 credits from the courses listed at PCU-WHS as outlined in Appendix III attached.

An individual learning plan will be agreed with each student when he or she registers with PCU-WHS.




