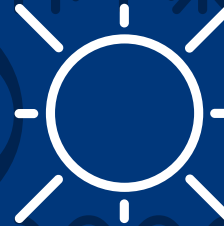

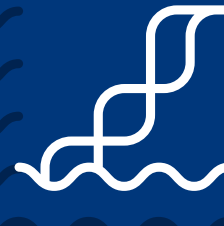

Mixalakwila

Our northern-most campus serves students in Port Hardy and beyond. Study options include upgrading, health care, land-based learning and more. We also offer on-site computer labs, study spaces and student supports.

Campbell River

Advanced trades facilities are just one of many reasons to study here – our campus also includes nursing, science and computer labs and a cutting-edge teaching kitchen and bistro. We're also home to the new CARTI Seaweed Innovation Hub.

Comox Valley

Our largest campus is expanding with the new Student Housing Commons (opening in 2025) and the future NIC Centre of Excellence for Early Learning. We've also added upgraded science labs to the mix. Choose from a vast range of program options, including fine arts and university studies.
